

What Happens When I Report a Vehicle to Buckle Up For Love?

Each week the Information Specialist at the Utah Safety Council listens to the messages left on the hotline and receives online submittals via e-mail. Occasionally report cards are also received in the mail.

The Information Specialist matches reported license plate numbers and details such as the color and make of a vehicle. (That's why you need to include these details in your reports!)

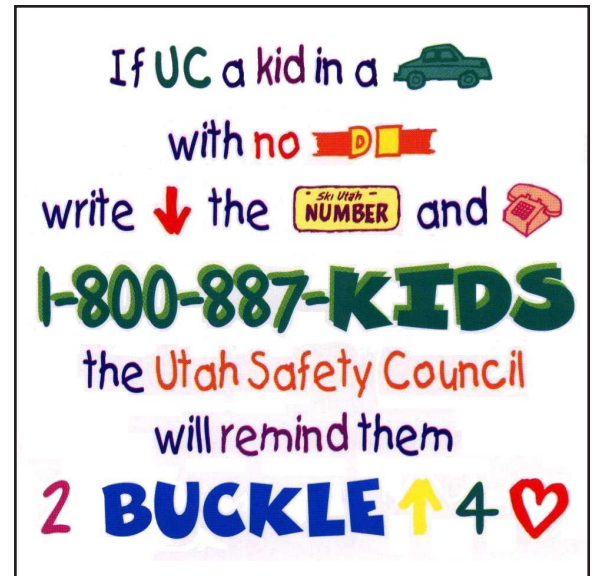
The mailing addresses of registered owners whose vehicles have been reported are accumulated. When there are over 200 reports, Buckle Up For Love conducts a mass mailing.

The mailing consists of an educational packet about the importance of child passenger safety. Included in the packet is:

- A friendly letter about what the program is and how it works
- The booklet "Car Seats: a Guide for Families 2009"
- A Boost 'Til 8 brochure
- Information about why the back seat is safer
- Ideas on how to keep a child in their car seat
- A list of locations all over Utah where anyone can have a free car seat inspection

The information given to Buckle Up For Love does not involve law enforcement and strict confidentiality is applied. This is a neighbor to neighbor program intended to give others the proper knowledge and resources that they need in order to keep the children in their vehicles safe.
