The Utah Safety Council is a membership based, private not-for-profit organization. It receives its support through membership donations from over 750 employer organizations throughout Utah, as well as from revenue generating activities such as training and sales of safety educational materials. The Utah Safety Council was founded in 1936 and established as the Utah Traffic Safety Council in 1939. This organization began as a response to the growing concern at the number of people killed and injured in traffic accidents.

Around 1945 the scope of the Utah Safety Council's programs extended to non-traffic areas, such as occupational and home safety, and the name Utah Safety Council was permanently adopted. In 1950, the Utah Safety Council was chartered by the National Safety Council as one of many local chapters that existed throughout the United States. In 1951, the Utah Safety Council was called upon by the Utah State Legislature to provide safety education and promotion services to the then newly formed Utah Department of Public Safety. Throughout its history, the Utah Safety Council has worked closely with numerous state government agencies, most notably the Utah Department of Public Safety and the Utah Labor Commission. Notwithstanding the fact that such relationships have been well-rooted and long-standing, the Utah Safety Council has continued to function as a non-governmental private organization. In 1956, the Utah Safety Council was formally incorporated as a non-profit corporation.

For 75 years, the Utah Safety Council has devoted its efforts to making Utah a safer place to live and work. The scope of the Utah Safety Council's programs and services cover three safety venues; occupational safety training and compliance, driver improvement training and education, as well as home and community safety and educational programs. Throughout its history, the Utah Safety Council has continued to expand its programs and services to provide the latest safety and health resources to business, industry and the community at large. The Utah Safety Council continues to be sought for assistance, insight and involvement in safety programs and initiatives, both public and private.

The number of visitors to the Utah Safety Council's website continues to increase. During 2010, the site averaged over 22,400 hits per month, a 13% increase from the previous year.

Safety Media Library

The Utah Safety Council's Safety Media Library is one of the largest, most comprehensive safety libraries with over 900 up-to-date titles. Titles contained in the library cover a broad spectrum of subjects including traffic safety, home safety, occupational safety and various other general safety topics. The Utah Labor Commission's Workplace Safety Grant Program provided \$25,000 during 2010 to help the Utah Safety Council provide the latest and most helpful training media presentations. During 2010, 61 safety titles were added to the library. This same year, safety titles were loaned over 4,900 times and viewed by more than 63,000 individuals.

Scholarship Program

During 2010, the Utah Labor Commission awarded a \$22,000 grant to the Utah Safety Council that provided scholarships to selected training offerings.

Scholarships consist of partial tuition subsidies as well as free training for small business. Scholarship were utilized by 124 companies for their employees. A total of 73% of all scholarships were awarded to small business. The scholarships ranged from free tuition to subsidies in the amount of \$525. Training offerings and the availability of scholarships were advertised in all Utah Safety Council publications, as well as in the Utah Manufacturers Association Bulletin, and the Utah Chapter of the American Society of Safety Engineers Newsletter. To date, over 1,500 scholarships have been awarded.

Safety Training



From half-day compliance seminars to four-day management programs, the courses offered by the Utah Safety Council are designed for all levels of safety expertise. During 2010, the Utah Safety Council trained over 2,800 students, and offered over 40 different occupational safety training courses at our training center in Salt Lake City.

Utah Safety Council Training Center

During 2010 the Utah Safety Council expanded its training center. Now there are three different sized training rooms to help meet the training needs of our customers. The Utah Safety Council's training center is located at 1574 West 1700 South, in the Lower Level, Salt Lake City, Utah.



On-site Occupational Safety Training

The Utah Safety Council is able to specially arrange many of its courses to help meet the training needs of our customers here in Salt Lake City, and surrounding areas. During 2010, over 50 special occupational courses were held for specific organizations either on-site or held at our training center.

Safety Training in Southern Utah

The Utah Safety Council offered the Building a Foundation for Occupational Safety course in St. George. This four-hour course is designed to give safety professionals the information and tools they require to develop and implement an effective safety program. This course was held at Dixie State College on January 28, 2010. Twenty-six organizations were able to attend this course. There are plans to hold even more safety training courses in Southern Utah during 2011.



Online Occupational Safety Training

The Utah Safety Council has implemented an online safety training program that features OSHA recognized and accepted outreach training for the construction and general industries. These online courses help companies satisfy and standardize their compliance training needs. All courses come with a printable certificate upon successful completion. Over 75 individuals took advantage of these online safety training courses during 2010.

Defensive Driving



Over 4,600 individuals completed the Defensive Driving public courses in 2010. The *Defensive Driving Course* is offered state-wide, and is publicly taught in twelve different locations throughout Utah. This four-hour *Defensive Driving Course* covers an array of topics from hazardous road conditions to safe following distances. Upon completion of the course, attendees are eligible to receive a 50 point reduction from their Utah driving record. Those attending who are 55 years of age or older, may receive discounts on their automobile insurance premiums.

Many employers have also taken advantage of the *Defensive Driving Course* by either arranging an on-site course, or by training their own instructor to offer the course to their employees. Instructor Development Courses are taught twice each year for those interested in becoming certified to teach these nationally-recognized courses. Twenty-two individuals completed the Instructor Development course during 2010.

Study after study has proven that drivers who participated in the Defensive Driving Course had fewer negligent driving arrests, and fewer collisions than drivers who did not participate.

Online Defensive Driving

The Utah Safety Council offers the National Safety Council's *Online Defensive Driving Course* (DDC). This course is a self-paced driver improvement program. In about four-hours, DDC Online offers practical strategies to reduce collision-related injuries, fatalities and costs. This course was updated in 2010 to address many of the current driving trends.

This online course is available in English and Spanish. During 2010, 313 individuals completed the online course. This is a 275% increase from the previous year.

Thirty-four courts utilize the Utah Safety Council's Online Defensive Driving Course.

Alive at 25



Alive at 25 is a young driver intervention program developed by the National Safety Council for drivers between 15 and 24 years of age. It is a four and ½ hour program that focuses on the decision making processes and behaviors that young drivers and passengers display in a motor vehicle. All courses are taught by law enforcement officers, and are currently offered in various high schools and courts throughout Utah.

Instructors hold candid conversations with students about what can happen if they practice risky behavior or make other poor choices in an automobile.



Driving behaviors and their implications are explored in-depth through a combination of subject discussions and interactive teaching tools.

The *Alive at 25* course qualifies for a 50 point reduction on a Utah Driver License.

Approximately 1,990 students completed the *Alive at 25* course in 2010, with a 68% increase from the previous year. Twenty-one schools support the *Alive at 25* program by holding courses at their location. Many courts refer their young traffic offenders to this course as well.



Since *Alive at 25* was implemented in Utah in October 2007, over 4,400 students have taken the course. Of those students, 99% said that *Alive at 25* will make them a safer driver and 98% would recommend that their peers take the course as well.

There is also a Facebook fan page for the *Alive at 25* course. Over 1,100 Facebook fans receive continual updates about the program, as well as safety tips.

The Utah Safety Council works with the Network of Employers for Traffic Safety (NETS) in reducing traffic crashes; the primary cause of lost work time and employee fatalities. NETS helps Utah businesses reduce the costs associated with motor vehicle crashes through the implementation of effective traffic safety programs.

Supported by 337 local employers, that included 18 new members in 2010, the Utah Network of Employers for Traffic Safety is continually striving to reduce the number of traffic crashes involving Utah workers and their families by helping employers design and implement traffic safety programs.

Occupant Protection Awards

As part of the NETS program the Utah Safety Council offers an Occupant Protection Award for companies achieving an 92% plus safety belt usage rate. During 2010, 13 outstanding examples of corporate efforts in the field of traffic safety were recognized.

Utah Safety Council Awards

The Utah Safety Council received the “Best E-Newsletter” award from the National Safety Council for the sixth consecutive year. The Utah Safety Council was also recognized by the National Safety Council for Best Improvement for its Basic Life Support Program.



Press Releases

The Utah Safety Council is dedicated to informing the public of important safety issues. Press releases are sent regularly to television stations, radio stations and newspapers on subjects such as safety belts, holiday safety, winter driving safety and carbon monoxide awareness. During 2010, a total of 8 press releases were issued and distributed to 168 media outlets.

Utah Criminal & Traffic Code Books

For the twelfth consecutive year, the Utah Safety Council has distributed the Utah Criminal and Traffic Code Book. The code book is compiled and printed each year following the legislative session. It was advertised and sold to law enforcement agencies, attorneys, judges, libraries, students and other interested citizens. The Utah Safety Council sold 4,689 books during calendar year 2010.

The Utah Safety Council is a distributor of Philips Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs). Philips was chosen because of their state-of-the-art technology, reliability, competitive pricing and their ease of use. These AEDs are also FDA approved. There are no current recalls on the Philips AEDs the Utah Safety Council distributes. In addition to offering AEDs for purchase the Utah Safety Council offers on-site CPR and AED training. This nationally-recognized training program supplies participants with a CPR/AED certification good for two years.

The Utah Safety Council participated in the State of Utah's Public Safety Summit in May 2010. Information about AEDs and training was provided at this conference.

Three Lunch & Learns were sponsored by Philips and the Utah Safety Council during 2010, on February 24th, July 13th and October 12th. Many individuals were able to attend these hands-on events and learn first hand how easy it is to use an AED.

Sixty-nine AED units were sold during 2010 to 22 different organizations. The Utah Safety Council trained all of these organizations on how to use their new AEDs.

National Safety Month

In partnership with the National Safety Council each June, the Utah Safety Council encourages businesses, individuals and communities to get involved and participate in National Safety Month. Each week during the month carries a theme that brings attention to critical safety issues.

The issues addressed during 2010 were:

- Prescription Drug Overdose Prevention
- Teen Driving Safety
- Preventing Overexertion at Work and at Home
- Dangers of Cell Phone Use While Driving
- Summer Safety

Our website offered tools and materials to help organizations and their employees stay safe both on- and off-the-job. These online resources made it convenient for people within our community, and even for people in far remote places, to access our information with ease. Utah Safety Council's National Safety Month home page received over 455 hits. In an effort to promote "Summer Safety" the Utah Safety Council distributed over 1,000 packets of sun screen to our member organizations.

The Utah Safety Council also hosted a Child Passenger Safety Checkpoint for Utah Safety Council members as well as those in the surrounding community for National Safety Month. There were a total of 28 car seats checked and 10 were replaced with car seats donated by Safe Kids Utah.

Governor Gary R. Herbert declared June 2010 as "Utah Safety Month".



The Utah Safety Council has continually focused its efforts in making Utah a safer place to live and work, and in that regard, we have been consistently and actively involved in programs that benefit the greater community. Over the years, the Utah Safety Council has been an active participant with the Utah Safe Kids Coalition, the Coalition for Utah Traffic Safety and the Utah Teen Driver Taskforce.

Representatives from the Utah Safety Council have participated on numerous advisory groups such as the Rocky Mountain Center for Occupational and Environmental Health Advisory Committee, and the Utah Hispanic Worker Advisory Committee in cooperation with the Pete Suazo Business Center and the Workers Compensation Fund.

Buckle Up For Love

The *Buckle Up For Love* program was implemented in 1995. The program is designed to reduce the number of injuries and fatalities that occur due to children riding unrestrained in a motor vehicle. Those who observe a child that is not restrained in a child safety seat or safety belt are encouraged to call 800.887.KIDS with the license plate number and location of the automobile, approximate age of the child and the date and time of the observation. The Utah Safety Council assures that the owner of the observed vehicle receives life-saving information in English and Spanish regarding the use of child safety seats. Observations can also be reported by filling out an online form or by mailing in observation cards, available free from the Utah Safety Council.

In 2010 approximately 361 people were sent educational packets about child passenger safety and over 25,000 print materials about the program were distributed to the community.

The *Buckle Up for Love* program participates in a Facebook fan page which boasts over 2,700 fans. The *Buckle Up for Love* Facebook fan page has proven to be an effective communication method to increase awareness about correct child safety seat usage. The fan page is a place where anyone can access and learn more about the *Buckle Up for Love* program, as well as ask questions related to child passenger safety to the Utah Safety Council's certified car seat technicians.

Take Safety Home



In January the Utah Safety Council launched its new *Take Safety Home* Program. A new section of the website was created to provide information and resources to help members of the community increase their awareness about off-the-job injuries. This section of the website averaged 425 hits per month.

Included these online resources is an interactive home safety checklist. This online program takes people through a typical house and help point out the possible dangers found within. Suggestions are given to help mitigate risks and prevent injuries at home.



In December 2010 a *Take Safety Home Employer's Guide* was published and distributed to all of the Utah Safety Council's member organizations. Additionally brochures were created and distributed addressing the top five causes of unintentional injuries at home, which are poisonings, drownings, falls, choking and suffocation and fires and burns.

Health & Safety Fairs and Conference Exhibits

The Utah Safety Council participated in fifteen Health and Safety fairs during 2010. These fairs included the Safe Kids Fair, Ultradent, Mother, Daughter and Sister Everywhere Safety Fair, Hexcel, Hogle Zoo, Boeing, American Express, USANA Health Sciences, Stampin' Up, Lowe's Health Fair, K-Mart Safety Fair, Utah Dream Center, South Jordan and West Valley Safety Nights and Kimberly-Clark.

Educational safety information distributed pertained to home safety, child passenger safety and traffic safety.

The Utah Safety Council also participated in the American General Contractors Safety Conference, the Governor's Public Safety Summit and the League of Cities and Towns Conference. The Utah Safety Council also co-sponsored and participated in the 27th Annual Utah Conference on Safety & Industrial Hygiene at the University of Utah, held on October 13-15, 2010.

Utah Safety Council members consist of 761 business and organization throughout Utah and the Intermountain West. During 2010, there were, 37 Sustaining Members, 68 Contributing Members, 9 Extended Members and 647 General Members. We appreciate our members and thank them for their continued support.
