Message From Our President

This has been an exciting year for the Utah Safety Council as you will read throughout the accomplishments highlighted in this annual report. Our focus has been to build stronger relationships with our members and the community.

I would like to mention a few highlights from our year. In February, we introduced a new logo and branding at the Gallivan Ice Rink. Our new brand focuses on the five areas of our organization: Membership Services, Occupational Safety, Traffic Safety, Emergency Care Safety, and Home and Community Safety. The update to the logo with the five colors representing each of our programs has brought a new focus to the Utah Safety Council. In May, we held our 1st Annual Crazy Pants Golf Tournament at Thanksgiving Point with 108 golfers, 18 hole sponsors, and 6 event sponsors, who all came together to have fun and raise money for our Home and Community program. This year's Annual Meeting and Awards Luncheon had a record high attendance and recognized the largest number of companies for their safety achievements.

In addition to company events, we partnered with the Salt Lake Bees for another Utah Safety Council night at the ballpark to promote our services, recognize our members, and celebrate National Safety Month. Our final member event for the year was our BBQ and Benefits luncheon at Wheeler Historic Farm where we introduced new benefits for our various levels of membership.

The National Safety Council recognized us nationally for our successful Traffic Safety programs. We also partnered with the Department of Public Safety and Utah Department of Transportation to develop a 30-minute online course for the Primary Seat Belt law enacted during 2015.

Our Occupational Safety training programs continue to grow, and a new partnership with Hexcel Corporation provided an opportunity to train more than 850 of their employees during this calendar year. We were also honored to recognize 22 individuals as they received their Advanced Safety Certificates.

All of this would not have been possible without the support from our Board of Directors and an incredible staff who are committed to helping our members and customers achieve their safety goals.

The Utah Safety Council was founded in 1936 and established as the Utah Traffic Safety Council in 1939. In 1945, the scope of the Council's programming extended to non-traffic areas. From 1951 to 2001, the Utah Safety Council also functioned as a division of the Utah Department of Public Safety. In 1956 the Utah Safety Council became a local chapter of the National Safety Council.

Throughout its history, the Utah Safety Council has continued to expand its programs and services to provide the latest safety and health resources to business, industry and the community at large. The Utah Safety Council's success and longevity can be attributed to creating a culture of relationship building focused on customer service. The Utah Safety Council has directed its efforts to continued improvement in programs and services.

The scope of the Utah Safety Council's programs and services are divided into five pillars: Membership Services, Occupational Safety, Traffic Safety, Emergency Care Safety, and Home & Community Safety.

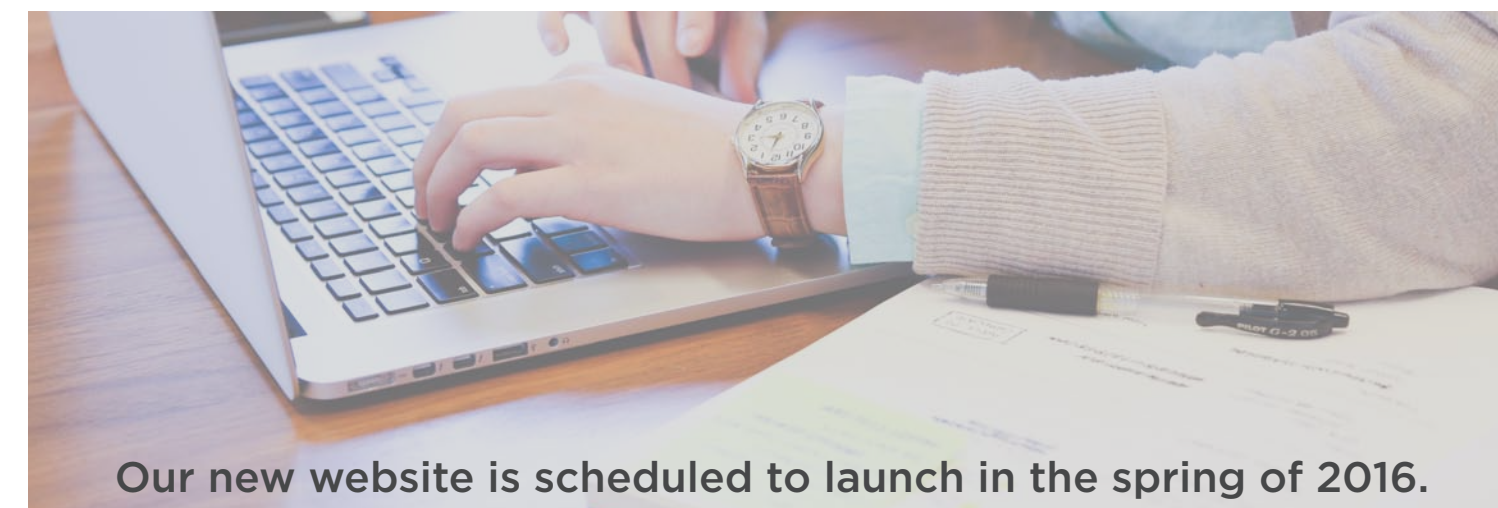

OCCUPATIONAL Safety

2015 Fast Facts:

Over **70** Occupational courses were offered in-house, with an additional **39** individual on-site courses.

46 individuals earned their Safety Certificate from our Advanced Safety, OSHA, and Office Safety Certificate Programs.

2,247 individuals completed one of our MSHA courses.

2,117 individuals completed our UITC contractor safety orientation.

200 members attended our Breakfast Safety Seminars.

Occupational Safety

Each year, the Utah Safety Council offers over 70 courses covering various topics in occupational safety.

These include Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) Compliance Courses for General Industry and Construction, Mine Safety and Health Administration (MSHA) New Miner and Refresher Training, and Contractor Safety Orientation (UITC) courses. Occupational courses range from half-day presentations to programs that are four days in duration. We also offer courses online that are designed for all levels of safety expertise.

In 2015, we added an additional six courses including: Workplace Violence Planning & Management, Office Safety, Office Ergonomics, Fire Extinguisher Training, NFPA 70E, and monthly breakfast safety seminars.

In a partnership with Hexcel Corporation, we also developed an employee training program and trained over 850 of Hexcel's employees in 2015.

On-Site Training

On-site training is convenient, flexible and effective! Our certified trainers can:

- Deliver any of our occupational safety training courses wherever and whenever you choose.
- Customize the content to include your organization's policies, procedures and forms.

Scholarship Program

During 2015, the Utah Labor Commission awarded a **\$20,000 grant** to the Utah Safety Council that provided scholarships to selected training offerings. Scholarships consist of partial tuition subsidies for Utah businesses. A total of **54 scholarships were awarded to 21 different companies. Since the inception of the program, over 2,300 scholarships have been awarded.**

Consulting Services

The Utah Safety Council matches our safety professionals to your organization's needs. Their expertise will help you answer questions and address critical workplace safety needs. Consulting services include, but are not limited to:

- Walk-through evaluations
- Safety program revisions/audits
- Policy development assistance
- Develop customized safety and training programs
- Ergonomic assessments
- Accident investigations

Contractor Safety Orientation (UITC)

The Contractor Safety Orientation (UITC) course is designed for contractors or contract employees who perform work on refinery properties. This one-day program is administered by the Utah Safety Council for the association of local petrochemical companies (Utah Industrial Training Cooperative). Topics include: general industrial safety, hearing conservation, elevated work, electrical safety, hand safety, and the worker's role in safety.

Over 2,100 people received UITC certification in 2015.



Mine Safety & Health Training (MSHA)

The Utah Safety Council has an MSHA-approved training program. During 2015, courses were held four times a month to help certify and re-certify those working in a surface metal/non-metal mining location, as well as underground locations. Training includes new/inexperienced miner training and annual training for experienced miners.

Over 2,200 people received their MSHA certification from the Utah Safety Council in 2015.



Safety Certificate Programs

Advanced Safety Certificate



The Utah Safety Council offers the National Safety Council's Advanced Safety Certificate (ASC) program. This certificate program is designed to maximize effectiveness for safety leaders and help establish best safety practices for an organization. Students are taught techniques to address administrative, technical and cultural elements that affect safety within their organizations. Upon fulfilling the requirements of the program, students have the ability to assess the safety needs in their workplace and implement effective solutions to eliminate unsafe conditions and reduce the frequency of unsafe acts.

Certificate in OSHA Compliance



The Utah Safety Council also offers the National Safety Council's Certificate in OSHA Compliance courses. These courses give students the ability to read and interpret OSHA standards in order to comply, avoid fines, and make their workplaces safer for all. Participants choose the compliance issues that are most important to their organization and receive in-depth reviews of the relevant standards through these courses.

Office Safety Certificate



Over 72,000 people are injured annually in an office setting. To help address these hazards, the Utah Safety Council has developed the new Office Safety Certificate program. This certificate is earned by taking Office Safety, Office Ergonomics, Fire Extinguisher Training, First Aid, CPR and AED for Business, and Workplace Violence Planning and Management within a two-year period.

Advanced Safety Certificate

The National Safety Council's Advanced Safety Certificate Program (ASC) is a nationally recognized curriculum based on proven best practices to develop your ability to solve occupational safety problems in your workplace.

Certificate in OSHA Compliance

With the National Safety Council's Certificate in OSHA Compliance, you will have the ability to read and interpret specific OSHA standards so you can be confident you know how to keep your employees safe and avoid fines.

Office Safety Certificate

Avoid injuries and illnesses in the office workplace by learning to identify common office hazards and how to mitigate the associated risks.

TRAFFIC Safety

2015 Fast Facts:

2,329 individuals completed our live Defensive Driving Course.

3,626 individuals completed our online Defensive Driving Course.

1,737 individuals under the age of 25 completed our Alive at 25 program.

368 individuals were certified in our tow truck driver program.

232 individuals completed our online Seat Belt Course after Utah's Primary Seat Belt Law was implemented in May, 2015.

Defensive Driving Training Awards

The Utah Safety Council received several awards from the National Safety Council at the 2015 Congress and Expo in Atlanta for our Defensive Driving programs. The Utah Safety Council is one of 21 chapters within the National Safety Council.

The Powerful Performance Award is presented to chapters that consistently achieve high levels of performance. The Utah Safety Council received:

- Powerful Performance: DDC 4 Fleet
- Powerful Performance: DDC Online

The Trendsetter Award is presented to chapters that work to build as many safe drivers as possible. The Utah Safety Council received:

- Trendsetter: Professional Truck Driver
- Trendsetter: DDC 4 Public
- Trendsetter: Alive at 25



Alive at 25[®] at 25

Alive at 25 is a young driver intervention program developed by the National Safety Council for drivers between 15 and 24 years of age. It is a four-hour program that focuses on the decision making processes and behaviors that young drivers and passengers display in a motor vehicle. All courses are taught by law enforcement officers and are currently offered in various high schools and courts throughout Utah. The Alive at 25 course also qualifies young drivers to receive a 50 point reduction on a Utah Driver License.

Over 1,700 students completed the Alive at 25 course in 2015. Nine schools support the Alive at 25 program by regularly holding courses at their location. In addition, several courts refer young traffic offenders to the Alive at 25 course. Since Alive at 25 was implemented in Utah in October 2007; **over 11,000 students have taken the course.**



Defensive Driving Course (DDC)

The Utah Safety Council conducts Defensive Driving Courses in 11 locations throughout Utah. **Over 2,300 individuals completed our live Defensive Driving Course in 2015.**

This four-hour course covers an array of topics from hazardous road conditions to safe following distances. Upon completion of the course, attendees are eligible to receive a 50 point reduction from their Utah driving record. Students who are 55 years of age or older may receive discounts on their automobile insurance premiums.

Many employers have also taken advantage of the Defensive Driving Course by either arranging an on-site course or by training their own instructor to offer the course to their employees. **During 2015, we held 10 on-site courses which trained 159 participants.** Instructor Development Courses are taught twice each year for those interested in becoming certified to teach the Defensive Driving Course. **Twelve individuals completed the Instructor Development Course with the Utah Safety Council during 2015.**

Defensive Driving Online Course

The Utah Safety Council offers the National Safety Council's Defensive Driving online course. This course is a self-paced driver improvement program. In approximately four-hours, DDC online offers practical strategies to reduce collision-related injuries, fatalities, and costs.

This course is utilized by many Utah companies to train their employees. Individuals are also referred to take the course by courts and the Utah Driver License Division. The course is available in English and Spanish. By completing the course, drivers are able to remove up to 50 points from their license.

During 2015, over 3,600 individuals completed the online course. Approximately 64 courts utilize the Utah Safety Council's Defensive Driving online Course. This program has seen continual growth over the last six years. We are looking forward to further expansion throughout the state in the upcoming years.

Utah Network of Employers for Traffic Safety (NETS)

The Utah Network of Employers for Traffic Safety (NETS) is administered by the Utah Safety Council. The goal of the program is to help Utah businesses reduce the costs associated with motor vehicle crashes through implementation of effective on-the-job traffic safety programs.



Supported by over 1,000 local employers, the Utah Network of Employers for Traffic Safety is continually striving to reduce the number of traffic crashes involving Utah workers and their families by helping employers design and implement traffic safety programs.

Drive Safely Work Week

Drive Safely Work Week (DSWW) was observed during the week of October 5-9, 2015. This workplace campaign seeks to improve the safety of employees, employee family members, and their communities. This year's theme was "#PlanAhead- Your Key to Driving Safely."

The Network of Employers for Traffic Safety (NETS) launched a free comprehensive online toolkit to help employers plan ahead for Drive Safely Work Week (DSWW).

This observance was promoted through an email campaign, the Utah NETS webpage, Utah NETS newsletter, and across the Utah Safety Council's social media platforms. We also used this opportunity to promote our new seat belt videos, which were viewed over 200 times that month.

Tow Truck Driver Certification

Since its launch in January 2011, over 1,200 Utah tow truck drivers have received their tow truck driver certification through the Utah Safety Council's online program.

This is the first tow truck driver certification program in Utah that is entirely online for the convenience of drivers. This course has been approved by the Motor Carrier Division of the Utah Department of Transportation as meeting the requirements of an authorized program through which to obtain designation as a Certified Tow Truck Driver. This certification covers topics specific to Utah's laws and driving conditions.

Utah Primary Seat Belt Law

In 2015, the Utah Safety Council worked with Safety Serve, Utah Department of Public Safety, and Utah Department of Transportation to develop an online Utah Seat Belt Course. The purpose of this course is to educate those that receive a seat belt citation about the importance of buckling up. This course was implemented after Utah's Primary Seat Belt Law went into effect in May. **232 individuals completed the course.**



EMERGENCY CARE Safety

2015 Fast Facts:

1,003 individuals completed the First Aid, CPR and AED certification course through the Utah Safety Council during 2015.

75 on-site first aid training courses were held at various companies throughout Utah.

55 individuals received their first aid instructor credentials in 2015.

61 AED units were sold to **16** different organizations.

82 First Aid kits were sold for a total of \$**4,551**.

First Aid, CPR and AED Training

The Utah Safety Council offers the National Safety Council's First Aid Training Programs. These programs and the accompanying certifications are nationally recognized. Employees trained in First Aid, CPR and AEDs and have the power to save lives. Learning how to respond effectively will also protect them at home, where an emergency can cost the same in lost work time and productivity.

These courses provide participants with the most up-to-date First Aid, CPR and AED training specifically focused on emergencies in the workplace. Participants learn life-saving skills including treatment for shock, bleeding and wounds, burns, medical emergencies and more.

In 2015, 1,003 people completed the First Aid, CPR and AED certification course through the Utah Safety Council. Additionally, **75 on-site first aid training courses** were held at various companies throughout Utah.

First Aid, CPR and AED Instructor Certification

The Utah Safety Council's emergency care instructor training meets OSHA guidelines for First Aid and CPR in the workplace and the latest CPR and Emergency Cardiovascular Care Guidelines. Participants are taught methods that involve, influence, and facilitate adult learning while refining their teaching skills. This course covers a proven, standardized method of teaching First Aid and CPR with high effectiveness. **A total of 55 people received their instructor credentials.**

Automated External Defibrillators

The Utah Safety Council is a distributor of Philips Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs). Two AED Breakfast Seminars were sponsored by the Utah Safety Council during 2015, in March and October.

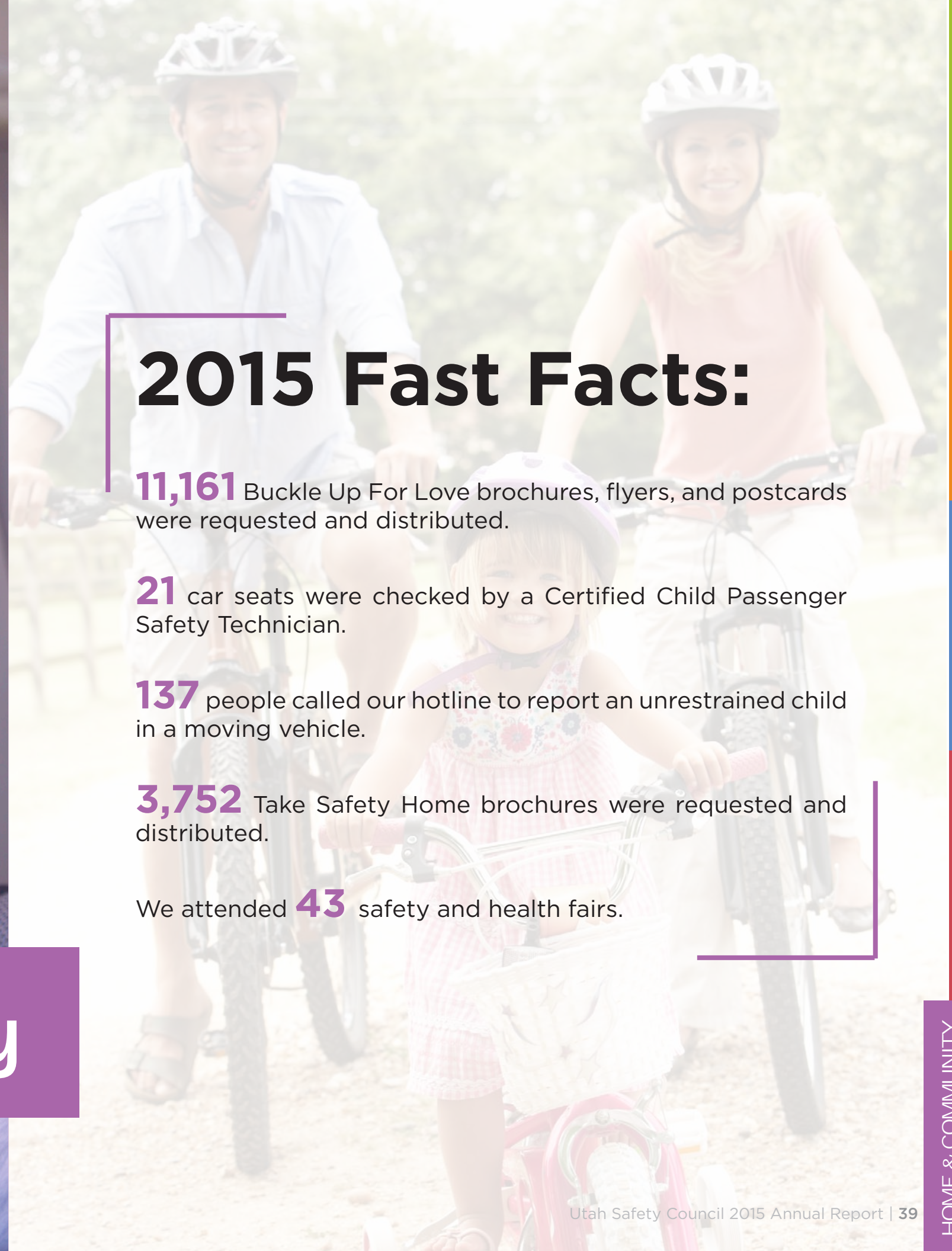
These seminars were free for members to attend, and provided useful information regarding the importance of not only keeping an AED in the workplace, but also learning how to use them effectively.

In 2015, 61 AED units were sold to 16 different organizations. The Utah Safety Council trained all of these organizations to properly use their new AEDs. **The total revenue for all AED sales and accessories was \$107,526.**





HOME & COMMUNITY Safety



2015 Fast Facts:

11,161 Buckle Up For Love brochures, flyers, and postcards were requested and distributed.

21 car seats were checked by a Certified Child Passenger Safety Technician.

137 people called our hotline to report an unrestrained child in a moving vehicle.

3,752 Take Safety Home brochures were requested and distributed.

We attended **43** safety and health fairs.

Home & Community Safety

The Utah Safety Council delivers programs and educational services directed at keeping individuals and families safe in their homes and communities. Disabling injuries are more numerous in the home than in the workplace and motor vehicle crashes combined. These programs aim to reduce these injuries and deaths by increasing safe behaviors and practices.

BUCKLE ↑ 4 ♥

Buckle Up For Love was implemented by the Utah Safety Council in 1995. The program is designed to reduce the number of child motor vehicle injuries and deaths in Utah by increasing proper car seat installation and use. Through the program, people can get their car seats checked for free by a Certified Child Passenger Safety Technician to ensure that they're installed and used correctly. **In 2015, 21 car seats were checked.**

Buckle Up For Love also provides an opportunity to those who observe an unrestrained child in a moving motor vehicle to call our hotline, **800.887.KIDS**, and report the license plate number, date and time, location, and description of the incident. The Utah Safety Council then sends the vehicle owner life-saving information on the importance of car seats and buckling up. **In 2015, 137 people called our hotline to report an unrestrained child in a moving vehicle.**

Buckle Up For Love also provides a variety of free educational materials in print and digital form. **We distributed over 11,000 Buckle Up For Love brochures, flyers, and postcards throughout the community.**

This year, Buckle Up For Love partnered with select Target and Walmart stores to distribute stickers (see above) onto car seat boxes. Currently, we have distributed over 500 stickers to 10 stores. We look forward to expanding this service to even more stores throughout the local community.

Take Safety Home

Take Safety Home was launched in 2009 and focuses on preventing the top five causes of death and injury in the home: poisonings, falls, fires and burns, choking and suffocation, and drowning. A variety of program materials are available to the public in print and on our website. They can request, free of charge, brochures on each of the five topics as well as an interactive home safety checklist CD-ROM.



Over 3,700 Take Safety Home brochures and CDs were requested and distributed throughout the community in 2015.

Health and Safety Fairs

The Utah Safety Council welcomes the opportunity to participate in employee and community health and safety fairs to provide information on our programs and the many services that we offer.

In 2015, we attended 43 safety and health fairs throughout the community, allowing us to spread safety information to an even broader audience.

Social Media

The Utah Safety Council shares Home & Community safety information throughout social media platforms such as: Facebook, Twitter, and Pinterest.

In 2015, our Buckle Up for Love page had more than 2,500 likes. By utilizing this outlet, we were able to share statistics, helpful videos, and relevant news across the largest social network in the United States.



National Safety Month

National Safety Month is an annual observance directed by the National Safety Council. It takes place in June of every year, and each week of the month is focused on a specific theme.

The themes for 2015 were:

- June 1-6 | Theme: Slips, trips and falls and Ergonomics
- June 7-13 | Prescription painkiller abuse
- June 14 - 20 | Emergency Preparedness
- June 21-27 | Utah Workplace Safety Week
- June 28-30 | Transportation

While each week focuses on a different topic, the overall theme in 2015 was “What I Live For.” Weekly emails were sent to our contacts introducing each topic, and linked to educational resources on our website. These resources included fact sheets, articles, 5-minute safety talks, quizzes, and posters (see one example above).



2nd Annual Night Out with the Salt Lake Bees

To kick off National Safety Month, the Utah Safety Council held our 2nd Annual Night Out with the Salt Lake Bees on June 26, 2015. Member organizations were encouraged to cheer on the Bees as we celebrated “What I Live For.” This was a fun opportunity for families and employees to get together and promote safety while watching a great baseball game. After all, spending a fun night with family and friends is a great reminder of why we all want to stay safe at home, at work, and on the go. The first 2,500 fans received a Utah Safety Council and Salt Lake Bees co-branded batting helmet.

We had two informational booths that members and fans could visit with our staff and learn more about our programs and training opportunities. Throughout the night, we played commercials from our YouTube videos and had several public service announcements highlighting many of our programs.

Partnering with the Salt Lake Bees was a great way to promote safety in the community and kick off National Safety Month. We look forward to partnering with the Salt Lake Bees for another fun night at the ballpark in 2016.



Utah Workplace Safety Week
