Lighten the Load: Backpack Safety

If you've had concerns about the effects that extra weight might have on your child's still-growing body, your instincts are correct. Backpacks that are too heavy can cause a lot of problems for kids, like back and shoulder pain, and poor posture. This can lead to long term health consequences. The National Safety Council reports that the problem has grabbed attention of lawmakers in some states, who have pushed for legislation requiring school districts to lighten the load. The American Heart Association recommends a backpack weigh no more than 10 percent of a child's weight.

When selecting a backpack, look for:

- An Ergonomic Design designed for efficiency and comfort.
- The Correct Size never wider or longer than your child's torso and never hanging more than 4 inches below the waist
- Padded Back and Shoulder Straps helps prevent sharp edges from digging into the back, while the padded shoulder straps will prevent digging into the shoulders
- Hip and Chest Belts to help transfer some of the weight to the hips and torso
- Multiple Compartments to better distribute the weight


